





Jesus told his disciples that at the end of time all of us would be judged by the way we have treated others.


At the Last Judgment at the end of time, Jesus Christ will come again in glory. He will say to those who have led lives of service to others, "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me" (Matthew 25:35–36).

For Jesus tells us, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40).

s disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to work for justice and peace for all people. We can do this by being a friend to others, especially those who feel lonely or left out. We are called to care for the physical needs of others.


Responding to the needs of others is an important part of our Catholic faith. When we respond to others' needs, we are following Jesus' example of showing mercy. The loving acts that we do to care for the needs of others are called the **Works** of Mercy.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are acts of love that help us care for the physical and material needs of others.

Corporal Works of Mercy

- Feed the hungry.
- Give drink to the thirsty.
- Clothe the naked.
- Visit the imprisoned.
- Shelter the homeless.
- Visit the sick.
- Bury the dead.

The Church encourages all members to care for those who are not able to care for themselves. You can check to find out ways your parish community practices the Corporal Works of Mercy.





We are called to care for the spiritual needs of others.


Another way that we can care for the needs of others is through the **Spiritual Works of Mercy**. These are acts of love that help us care for the needs of people's hearts, minds, and souls.

Spiritual Works of Mercy

- Admonish the sinner.
 (Give correction to those who need it.)
- Instruct the ignorant.
 (Share our knowledge with others.)
- Counsel the doubtful.
 (Give advice to those who need it.)
- Comfort the sorrowful.
 (Comfort those who suffer.)
- Bear wrongs patiently.
 (Be patient with others.)
- Forgive all injuries.
 (Forgive those who hurt us.)
- Pray for the living and the dead.

Both the Corporal and Spiritual
Works of Mercy are important
practices of our Catholic faith. We can ask
the Holy Spirit to guide us in carrying out
these acts of love in our daily lives. When
we carry out these Works of Mercy, we are
giving witness to Jesus Christ.
